

Building a Dining Table Shana's Table, Episode 2



Glue is spread on the pieces that are to be laminated and become the table legs. All mating surfaces receive glue which is applied with 3 inch paint rollers.



The homemade clamps are now put into place and the clamp's wooden jaws are brought up snug. Notice how the clamps are angled to take full advantage of the jaw's length. Using an impact wrench, Libba tightens down the clamps. The four leg blanks will then be put aside until the glue has dried.



Libba uses the radial arm saw to cut the table aprons to length. Two at 3 ½" x 30" and two at 3 ½" x 66". Then with a dado blade in the table saw, Shana cuts the grooves in the aprons that will receive buttons for attaching the top.
