Service Projects Report - Lee Owens

Keith Bryan built 4 rocking chairs for a veteran's retirement facility. We're building 40 small boxes for the same organization. The small boxes are for storage of personal items. We've been asked to

build 24 chests of drawers. The proposal must be made and submitted to the client's board of directors for execution next year. A show of hands by those willing to work on this project was taken. 20 people present indicated they will participate. We have 2 project pending approval by the Lighthouse for the blind. One is the circular reception desk, the other is shelves for computers. We have not been given any status pro or con about these projects. Educational Outreach Report – Educational Outreach Report By

Keith made some containers to hold the correct length nails for all the tables. Keith made an assembly jig that makes putting the first pieces together very easy. Be sure to drill the holes for the nails. Use a 5/64" diameter drill. Warren asked anyone who has wood they want to donate to contact him. He will take care of planning and any other questions you have. Keith announced there would be a check in procedure so we will have a record of how many birdhouse kits each of us brings. The birdhouse project counts as the October meeting.

Additional topics:

Election of officers will be done in December because of the trip to St. Joseph's Abbey in November. There are other changes that are needed and will be announced as they come due. Thanks to Shawn and Kesh for they work they've done that enables us to retrieve data on individual members participation. 27 people have not met the project requirements. The dangers of using alcohol. Methanol is very toxic. We use denatured alcohol. Methanol is used to make denatured alcohol. Be sure to be in a well-ventilated area whenever you are using denatured alcohol. Non grain raising die has significant amounts of methanol in it. Long story short check to see if the chemical you are using has methanol as a component.
